#### **Old Business**

Josh with Coal Country Electric, LLC: Tonya Wellington has talked to Josh. He needs to collaborate with Otter Tail to schedule the work at city hall.

Scott Liab: Tonya Wellington-Auditor has sent the estimate for the kitchen door at city hall to Turtle Lake American Legion for a donation to cover the cost. The Turtle Lake American Legion will have their meeting the second week in October. Gravel for the City Streets: There has been gravel applied to the streets in town. If there is more needed the council will bring in another load.

Wilson Law Firm: Wilson Law Firm was asked if they would be the City Attorney for Mercer. The council was presented with a proposal document from Wilson Law Firm. The hourly rate is \$225.00 and a retainer of \$2,000.00. Travel time is at half of the hourly rate.

Fire Hydrant Flush: The council will work together to get fire hydrants flushed within the next couple of weeks.

Accessibility Plan Update: Tonya Wellington-Auditor has ordered the exit signs for doors and handicap parking sign for outside. Ken Thomsen and Tonya Wellington will work together to get the restroom updated to meet Handicap Compliance.

### New Business

Otter Tail Electric: Tonya Wellington-Auditor has informed the council that we are paying late fees every month. The bill date cannot be changed. The council decided to have Tonya Wellington pay the bill as soon as it comes. Joe Jerkovich made the motion to pay the Otter Tail bill when it comes so the city will have no more late fees. Randy Zinke seconded. Joe Jerkovich and Randy Zinke voted Aye. Motion carried.
